PERCEPTIONS OF CLINICAL CARE IN THE HOME

Key Data Points

73%

Of adults are confident in the quality of care they would receive if they received clinical care in the home.

70%

Of adults would be comfortable receiving health care services from a clinical care provider in a home setting.

85%

Of adults who say they or a family member has received clinical care in the home would recommend receiving this type of care to a family member or friend. 56%

Of adults say it should be a priority for the federal government to increase access to clinical care in the home.



Key Findings

- 1. Adults are most likely to be interested in receiving clinical care in 4. Overall, adults are more likely to agree with the barriers to the home for an annual physical, preventative services, and diagnostic services. These are the services adults are also most likely to seek clinical care in the home for.
- 2. Overall, adults are comfortable and confident in receiving clinical care in the home. About three quarters of adults would be comfortable receiving health care services from a clinical care provider in a home setting (70%) and are confident in the quality of care they would receive (73%).
- 3. Adults are split on if they are more comfortable speaking with a health care provider in a home setting or medical facility. Comfort and convenience are the main reasons adults would choose to seek clinical care in the home as opposed to a facility-based setting, while adults are most likely to seek facility-based care as opposed to clinical care in the home because of concerns about a sterile environment. preference, cost, and quality of care.

- receiving clinical care in the home compared to receiving facility**based care.** Cost and time are seen as the largest obstacles to receiving facility-based care, while cost and insurance coverage of services are seen as the largest obstacles to receiving clinical care in the home.
- 5. Adults who have personally experienced clinical care in the home had a positive experience. Among adults who say they or a family member has received clinical care in the home, a strong majority (88%) were satisfied with the care they received and would recommend receiving this type of care to a family member or friend (85%).
- 6. Adults thinking improving access to clinical care in the home should be a priority for Congress. Two thirds of adults say it should be a priority for the federal government to increase access to clinical care in the home, and nearly half of adults (46%) would be more likely to support an elected official who supported expanding clinical care in the home.


OBSTACLES TO CARE



After reading about clinical care in the home, half of adults (52%) are familiar with the option to receive clinical care in the home.

Clinical care in the home refers to a spectrum of health services provided in the home or place of dwelling instead of in a facility, such as hospital-level or acute care, primary care, skilled nursing and therapy services, and hospice. Services may include routine physician visits, chronic disease management (such as remote patient monitoring), laboratory and diagnostic services (such as blood draws and x-rays), home infusion (such as antibiotics), wound care, physical or occupational therapy, inhome dialysis, and other care provided in the home setting rather than a facility, and regardless of age and health conditions.


How familiar are you, if at all, with the option to receive clinical care in the home?






Adults who identified as caregivers are more likely to be familiar with the option to receive clinical care in the home (67%).

How familiar are you, if at all, with the option to receive clinical care in the home?




Half of adults are interested in receiving clinical care in the home for an annual physical (58%), preventative services (56%), diagnostic services (54%), lab services (53%), and remote monitoring services (51%).

Based on what you know, how interested would you be, if at all, in receiving clinical care in the home for the following health services?




A majority of adults (70%) would be comfortable receiving health care services from a clinical care provider in a home setting.

How comfortable would you be, if at all, receiving health care services from a clinical care provider in a home setting?




Similarly, three quarters of adults (73%) are confident in the quality of care provided if they received clinical care in the home.

Caregivers are especially confident in the quality of care if they were receiving clinical care in the home (85% confident).


And, how confident would you be, if at all, with the quality of care provided if you were receiving clinical care in the home?

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

PREFERENCES FOR CARE

Adults are most likely to prefer to receive personal care services (52%), remote monitoring (50%), and in-home pharmacy services (49%) in the home rather than a health care facility.

If you had a choice, would you prefer to receive each of the following services in the home or in a facility-based setting?




A plurality of adults prefer to receive an annual physical or wellness visit (42%), laboratory services (43%) and hospital level or acute care (42%) in a health care facility.

Comfort and convenience are the main reasons adults would choose to seek clinical care in the home as opposed to a facility-based setting.


Which of the following reasons, if any, describe why you would choose to seek **clinical care in the home as opposed to facility-based care?** Select all that apply.

Which of the following reasons, if any describe why you would choose to **seek facility-based care as opposed to clinical care in the home?** Select all that apply.





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

Some believe the following can be obstacles to receiving facility-based care. For you personally, would you agree or disagree that the following would be obstacles if you were to seek to receive facility-based care?





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

About a tenth of adults (12%) have received clinical care in the home.


Have you or a family member ever received clinical care in the home before? Please select all that apply.



How likely would you be, if at all, to seek out clinical care in your home again?



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




RESPONDENT PROFILE
