

OVERALL OBJECTIVES


- Raise the profile of a new kind of care in the home.

RESEARCH & THOUGHT LEADERSHIP

- We collect research and list on our website under resources.
- We share research widely when it is published.
- We need our own research:
 - Survey **caregivers** about their experience, and whether more clinical care in the home makes them feel more or less comfortable.
 - Survey of providers, specifically whether home-based options would help alleviate burnout.
 - Survey of patients and caregivers about how/if being at home impacts mental health and resilience
 - Somehow spotlight health equity angle.
 - Modeling for Congressional Budget Office.

Survey Says: Bipartisan Support for Increasing Access to Clinical Care in the Home

A national survey, conducted by Morning Consult on behalf of Moving Health Home, speaks to the widespread support by adults for receiving care in their homes from across the care continuum.

Americans Are Comfortable Receiving Care in the Home

70% of those surveyed are comfortable with care in the home citing that familiarity helps alleviate anxiety.

of caregivers are confident in the quality of receiving care in the home.



Americans Support Expanded Access to Care in the Home






GOVERNANCE & OPERATING PRINCIPLES





Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS): Guiding an Improved

Dementia Experience (GUIDE) Model (7/31) - On July 31, 2023, CMS announced the

Guiding an Improved Dementia Experience (GUIDE) Model, which aims to support

people living with dementia and their unpaid caregivers. CMS is accepting letters of
interest for the GUIDE Model through September 15, 2023, and will release a GUIDE

Request for Applications (RFA) for the model in Fall 2023. The model will launch on July
1, 2024, and run for eight years. Specifically, the GUIDE Model will offer a standard
approach to care, including 24/7 access to a support line, as well as caregiver training,
education, and support services. This will allow people living with dementia to remain
safely in their homes for longer and improve quality of life for both people living with
dementia and their unpaid caregivers.

National Institute on Aging: Help Shape the Future of Dementia Home- and Community-Based Services (7/26) - The NIA announced the Community Care Network for Dementia (CaN-D), which would develop valuable data tools to aid analysis of the structure, processes, and outcome measures of dementia home- and community-based services (HCBS). HCBS support people living with dementia in multiple aspects of daily life, including personal care, medication management, meal preparation, social engagement, and cognitive stimulation. Expression of interest are due by August
15.

CMS: End-Stage Renal Disease (ESRD) Treatment Choice (ETC) Model Lays Strong
Foundation for In-Home Renal Care (7/24) - CMS released its <u>first annual evaluation</u>
of the ESRD ETC Model, which found modest early gains in home dialysis training and
transplant rates, laying a strong foundation for the future of in-home renal care. The
model, which was introduced Jan. 1, 2021, was designed to push for greater utilization of
in-home renal care services. By supporting patient selection of home dialysis and
transplant through enhanced patient education, and other strategies, the model is
intended to result in lower Medicare payments while preserving or enhancing quality of
care for beneficiaries. For additional coverage, see McKnights Home Care.

Congress

Senate Health, Education, Labor & Pensions (HELP) Committee: Chairman Sanders (I-VT) Introduces Legislation on Primary Care (7/19) - Sen. Sanders (I-VT) introduced the Primary Care and Health Workforce Expansion Act, which would improve access to and the quality of primary health care, expand the health workforce, among others. Specifically, the legislation includes a fund of \$2 million annually over the next five years to establish a technical assistance center to support the direct care workforce and family caregivers. Senate: Sens. Capito (R-WV) and Baldwin (D-WI) Introduced Bill to Strengthen Palliative and Hospice Care Workforce (7/12) - On July 11, Sens. Baldwin (D-WI) and Capito (R-WV) introduced the Palliative Care and Hospice Education and Training Act (PCHETA) (S. 2243), which would meet the growing demand for serious illness care by investing in training, education and research for the palliative care and hospice workforce. Specifically, the bill includes training for inter-professional team-based palliative medicine, including home care.
